Signal box project gets major grant

We're delighted to report the news that the CLT has just heard that we have attracted a very substantial grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund for the Hebden Bridge signal box project.

In total we will receive £99,600, which will enable us not only to conserve the fabric of the building and adapt it for its new life as a heritage centre and quirky overnight accommodation but also to run a linked heritage education project next year focused on the historical and economic importance of the railway to local life.



It is part of the CLT's charitable remit to act as the legal custodian, on behalf of the whole community, of important local community buildings and we were asked three years ago to do our best for the signal box by the Friends of Hebden Bridge Station, who were concerned at the future of the building which is now decommissioned. Hebden Bridge signal box has the original signal frame in situ and is grade II listed.
