
CVCLT news November 2023


Grant success for our first Hebden home



Refugee homes in Hebden Bridge

We are finalising our budget and contractors for bringing 2 empty properties in Hebden Bridge back into use. CMBC were successful in applying for a government grant agreement to fund most of the works and we will take a lease on the properties. Once the refugee need dissipates the homes will become available to meet the local housing need.

Hi, I'm Anna and I'm currently doing some research for my PhD in community-led housing. The research is looking at different ideas, visions and real-life experiences of community within housing projects. Jerusalem Farm Cottage

Sally, one of our trustees, has led on trying to bring this empty rural property back into use as an affordable rented home. The offer of a relatively short lease combined with high costs and interest rates makes it unviable. A conversation with Calderdale MBC where both sides were determined to make the project work has led to the potential of an offer of an interest free loan that would make it possible.

We let our properties through https://keychoice.housingapplications.co.uk/property-search/ and apply some of our own local criteria. You must be registered on Keychoice to make an application. Subscribing to our newsletter is the way to be first to know when a property is available.
